Class outline, goal

Children form themselves through a variety of human relationships. In this class, we will consider how childcare workers should relate to children in order to promote their social growth.Next, we will comprehensively examine how "human relations" is positioned in the childcare curriculum, in terms of its relationship with other childcare subjects and the development of childcare. In addition, we will consider how to form human relationships with children through play using information devices, and the content of such play according to their development.

- 13 . Practicing childcare that fosters human relationships (creating a teaching plan)
- 14. Practicing childcare that fosters human relationships (simulated childcare)
- 15. Review of the practice and presentation of future tasks

- (2) understand child development from the perspective of human relations, and to learn about specific childcare content.
